LITERACY

During this half term Year 1 will be:

- Writing a descriptive piece of writing about a Toy Story character.
- Reading, writing, and performing simple poems about toys.
- Continuing the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised Programme to improve our reading.

Practising our letter formation and reading and writing words using our Phonic knowledge.

Please ensure children have their PE kits in school every day.

 Year 1 children will have two PE lessons a week. Our P.E topics this half term are: 'Fun and Games' and 'Gymnastics'. Earrings must be removed on P.E days for safety.

PSHE

- Celebrating our differences.

RE

We will be answering the question 'How do Christians celebrate Christmas?'. The children will:

- Visit a local church
- Name and talk about the Bible's story of Christmas
- Think about where they belong and special ceremonies they have participated in
- Suggest meanings for religious actions and symbols
- Discuss and connect ideas between different religions

HISTORY

This half term we will be:

- Comparing old toys and modern toys.
- Looking and discussing about our favourite toys.
- Looking at the toys which our parents and grandparents played with.
- Looking at what toys were like up to 100 years ago.
- Learning about the history of the Teddy bear.

SCIENCE

This half term we will be:

- Distinguishing between an object and the material from which it is made e.g. a pencil is made from wood, a water bottle is made from plastic.
- Describing the simple physical properties of everyday materials using adjectives like stretchy, bendy, rough.
- Comparing and describing different materials.

MATHS

This half term we will be:

- Comparing the length and weight of objects.
- Comparing two sets of objects and amounts.
- Understand and use the symbols of greater than >,
 less than < and equals = to compare amounts.
- Explain what a whole is and that it can be split into parts.
- Show 1 more or 1 less than a number.
- Use the bar model to represent a whole partitioned into two parts.
- Partition numbers 1-5 in different ways.

CREATIVE ARTS

In our creative Arts, we will be:

- Art completing the unit 'Make your Mark' from the scheme 'Kapow'. The children will focus on the artist 'Kathy Hilderbrandt'.
- DT designing and making moving toys using paper and card.
- Musical story telling.

COMPUTING

We will be completing the unit 'Digital Painting'. The children will be:

- Developing their understating of a range of tools used for digital painting.
- Use the tools learnt to create their own digital painting.
- Discussing their preferences when painting with and without the use of digital devices.
